- e. Geared toward the safety professional, Ms. Glathar will cover the basics of environmental compliance and management for regulated operations. The presentation will introduce a wide variety of topics such as hazardous waste, wastewater, stormwater, spill plans, oil storage, air regulations, and more. Ms. Glathar will also include information on environmental regulatory structure, potentially applicable regulations, common compliance struggles, and additional resources for further assistance.
- f. Discussion:
 - i. What are often over-looked or aha moments? Focus on housekeeping and curb appeal. If it looks like waste then regulators may treat it as waste.
 - ii. Labels are a huge problem and are the most cited problem.
 - iii. Open containers are a big problem.
 - iv. Universal waste of flo tubes that aren't labeled. Need to dispose within one year.
 - v. Don't let permits expire because then have to re-apply as a new permittee.
 - vi. Galvanized roofs have zinc and can trigger treatment requirements of the run-off. Solution can be to paint the roof, downspout filters, downspout into a planter box. Release of zinc is fairly constant throughout the life of the roof.
 - vii. Why are environmental fines so much higher than OSHA fines? Not sure. Perhaps when the laws were authorized.
 - viii. If have fire. Fire extinguishing is first priority and is an exception for stormwater discharge.
